- Respect in Sport Recertification
 - In the Spring of 2017, Hockey Alberta announced that effective the 2018-2019 season Parents and Coaches/Team Officials would be required to recertify every four seasons.
 - The requirement to recertify came into effect May 1, 2018
 - For the 2018-2019 season, the requirement to recertify affects Parents and Coaches/Team
 Officials who completed their Respect in sport certification prior to the 2015-2016 season
 - Hockey Calgary believes in 'Continuing Education' and this program was never designed to be a 'one and done' and believe that as leaders in hockey is to continually educate the members and promote positive behaviours in the hockey environment.

- Atom League Outcomes
 - For the upcoming 2018-2019 season, the Atom League Structure will maintain the same structure as operated in the 2017-2018 season.
 - o For SW, this will likely mean one team in division 1, 2 & 3 and two teams in division 4 7
 - However divisions will also be consistent with the new Hockey Alberta Tiering system as well.
 - This will be confirmed once registration has closed, to determine the # of players.

PeeWee League Structure

- For the upcoming 2018-2019 season, Hockey Calgary and member associations will be adopting the same structure as the Atom League and apply it to the PeeWee Age Category.
- Southwest will be consistent with Hockey Calgary and the new Hockey Alberta Tiering Standardization.

Hockey Alberta Standardization Tiering Model

- Over the past year, Hockey Alberta's Minor Leagues Committee has worked extensively on a Standardization Tiering Model to build a unified structure.
- Under the Alberta one Standardized Tiering Model, Leagues have agreed to operate six tiers within the divisions of Atom, PeeWee, Bantam and Midget

Novice ½ Ice Strategies

- Hockey Canada announced the following at their AGM in Spring of 2017:
 - It is recommended that all games at the Novice level of hockey be played ½ ice for the 2017/2018 and the 2018/2019 seasons
 - In 2019-2020, it will be mandatory that all games at the Novice level of hockey under the Hockey Canada umbrella be played in a ½ ice format
- Upon review and analysis that has been completed, Hockey Calgary and member associations decided to move away from the current full ice format and implement 'some form' of ½ ice hockey at the Novice age category for the 2018-2019 season as recommended by Hockey Canada in preparation for the full change in 2019-2020 season
- For the 2018-2019 season, Hockey Calgary and member associations will adopt and 'test' a single birth year format for the Novice Age Category. Whereby the 2010 and 2011 born players will play separate divisions
 - 2011 born players ½ ice model
 - 2010 born players remain full ice model

Questions?

- Goalie creases on half ice? There is a conversation, no determination at this time.
- Will the ½ ice model will they be tiered teams? Yes
- Will splitting up the game affect team bonding? This will be something that could be reviewed at the end of the season. Need to speak of the program positively as ultimately this is about development. Tournaments will be referred to as Jamborees.
- Will there be any 'A' lines and 'B' line discussion with the Coaches? We want the coaches to be talking to each other to ensure the players are 'matched up' best as possible and to ensure the team is having fun. We don't want the 4 'better' players playing against the 4 'weaker' players.
- Hockey Edmonton is also doing what we are doing as well as in Red Deer. Hockey
 Alberta is trying to get the smaller towns to 'buy in', however not sure about the
 single year process.
- Will there be a limited number of Jamborees? The 1st year could be challenging and it will be a learning curve.
- Rural cities don't have the numbers to create the 1st and 2nd year teams? Hockey Calgary, Red Deer and Edmonton have a program and as Hockey Canada is mandating by 2019-2010, need to work through the challenges.


- Hockey Calgary believes Southwest Hockey has some of the best Bylaws and Policies and Procedures
- Boundaries will be shuffled to next year, and there has been no official discussion at this time.
- O Questions?
 - Why are they doing boundaries again? There does need to be some longevity and not carve boundaries up every 2 3 years. Answer: There is a lot of conversation and comes down to rink locations. It is very complicated. SWH is very lucky with the rinks within our boundaries and there are some Associations that don't even have one rink within their boundaries. SWH may also be looking at ice with Tsuut'ina (TTN) when they come in in 2019. Southland Hockey had a contract with them many years ago and TTN approached SWH regarding the previous contract, so we are pursuing this option.

TREASURER REPORT - Presented by Kristi Oiring

Introduction by Joe Strang

Income Statement and Operations Statement reviewed.

- Finances
 - Average fee increase over last year is 5%
 - Average fee increase since the 2015/2016 season is 10%
 - Oakridge announced a 3.5% increase which is an 8% increase over 2 years
 - o City of Calgary flood charges, adds 17% to each ice time
 - Direct Program Costs which include Ice Rental, Hockey Calgary/Hockey Alberta/Hockey
 Canada Fees & Referees are 80% of our budget



- Successful raffle this year
- We pay fees, why do we have to fundraise? Without fundraising, last year we would have had a \$70k loss this year. Casinos come every 18-24 months and have been bringing in about \$70k. We do a fundraiser (such as vehicle/calendar raffle) on the off years to the Casinos.
- Jersey replacements will also be added to the budget; which equates to about \$50k per year. Did not want to burden registration fees, therefore will earmark the raffle money for this.

- Accrued receivables with money owed back to SW from the SCHHL. Each of the SCHHL
 Associations split the expenses, however SWH fronted the money and now the other 4 Associations will reimburse SWH.
- o Questions?
 - Do we consider negotiating multi-rate costs for arenas? We do not have an opportunity to negotiate they have a monopoly and there is no negotiation options. They give us the rate. This past year we didn't have a sponsorship person who can help with these conversations to help bring in money...example; dressing room advertising.
 - What about sponsored jerseys? Yes, this is something we are looking at especially with the replacement of jerseys beginning. We'll then need a person who will reach out to companies and look for a company that will sponsor. When we are doing our budget we don't have that in at this time and we will try to. Hugh Lasham is currently looking into this to determine what sponsorship dollars would be for each Age Group, and are only looking to do about 3 Age Groups this coming season for jersey replacement.
 - o Tax Receipt? No, as we are a Society and not a Charity.
 - Is this a single person or group effort finding sponsorships? Mainly, this is a one person job.
 This is 'labor intensive' and this person would need to approach, follow up and present the benefits to the company about why they should support Southwest Hockey.
 - Is there any way to incorporate an evaluation fee inside the registration fee? Chris could speak to this, as that is not my area of expertise.
 - When will the composites be ready, as it would be nice to see them hanging? Answer will be working with Cardel to have previous Association composites moved, and then hang the SWH composites.

DEVELOPMENT REPORT

- Prep Camps; run by Stix Hockey and Evolution Goaltending
 - 153 of the 252 available spots were filled Players
 - Some issues with the ice times and have looked at this year.
 - 38 of the 68 available spots were filled Goalies
- Organized Bantam Checking clinics
 - Was attended by #54 players
 - Also held a Checking Clinic for PW Players who affiliated to Bantam Checking divisions.
- Provided a "Try a Goalie" Camp for those interested in the goaltender position.
 - Provided equipment and training for 12 kids.
 - There was a nominal charge.
 - If you know kids who are interested please consider. There is a goaltending challenge with regards to a shortage and need to have a positive attitude.
 - Goalie Mentor Program (Sam Haines & Chris Svenson), along with the Director of Coaches, SWH is working on some items and resources for next year and hope we can help more on ice and get the older kids to come out and help and use some of the

inside resources. You know now that there is a program. Ask you coach and be sure to reach out.

• Question?

- Cost is a concern. Is there any consideration for a registration reduction or gear provided beyond Novice? That is a topic of discussion as well. There is two sides to that and families who have financial challenges....where do you stop? The conversation is not closed, and the Board is open to suggestions, however at this time registration reduction is not a solution.
- Could a data base be created to have families advertise goalie gear that their player has outgrown? That could be something to look into.
- Try a Goalie and Evolution....is there any thought to having a rotating goalie coach to attend practices? SW is trying to have a Goalie Coach on this team, however this is a technical position and obviously as a parent you want you player to be getting taught correctly. SWH is still trying to work through this and may also look at older players coming to mentor and help. There are lots of places to spend money, however working within a limit.
- Hockey Alberta has partnered with Power Edge Pro Training Systems/Small Area Games. Has the Association looked into the cost of purchasing this system for Atom and Novice? SWH was at this past Hockey Alberta meeting and have not 'action-ed' this.
- What about partnering / mentoring older teams with younger teams? For example; pair up Midget 1 and Novice 1 throughout the year and Coaches can work together. Rather than pairing up individuals, pairing up teams would allow a bigger 'pool' of players to be able to attend the Novice 1's practice. Answer: this is something that could be looked at. With the kids more engaged and older kids mentoring, this is a great point, although don't have a firm answer.
- Is it possible to make our merchandise more accessible through the year, and have available at places like Adrenaline? Hugh – yes there were some manufacturing problems, however want to keep SW apparel in house as the margin is more reasonable.
- Arranged bi-monthly goalie training for interested goalies.
 - 21 goalies attended GDI sessions
 - 23 goalies attended Evolution sessions
 - Only 12 goalies attended multiple sessions
 - Training was provided by GDI, Evolution
 - Question: Does it have to be GDI or Evolution? No, vetted a company and then hire.

COACHING REPORT – Presented by Cori-Ann Mogan

- There were 275 Coaches for 54 teams (down 8 teams from last year)
- SWHA held our own coach certification clinics this year.
- Year End Coaches Survey was sent on April 5th
 - 85% of teams responded. 331 responses. An average of 7 responses per team.
 - Overall there is a BIG range of feedback. Members either loved everything, hated everything and there was a range of others in between. Unless there is consistency, there is not much that will be followed up on.
 - Seeding of teams and evaluations were a key point of feedback.
 - Seeding is mostly decided by Hockey Calgary and the association size limits movement within divisions.
 - There have been changes to evaluation process for next season.

ICE REPORT

- o Southwest Hockey continued with using the OneClicklce Scheduling Software.
- o Must always keep in mind that there is a whole myriad of scenarios to be considered.
- o Parents want more ice, although attaining more ice means fees may increase further.
- Breakdown of ice for this season was:
 - Over last year, the <u>Weekly Average</u> is slightly up. This includes BOTH games & practices. This is the average # of ice times in a 7 day period.
 - Average # of practices is slightly up or comparable over last season.
 - Average # of ice times includes Hockey Calgary games and is slightly up or comparable.
 - Average # of hours is slightly up or comparable over last season.

EVALUATIONS REPORT – Presented by Cori-Ann Mogan

- Overall, the evaluations process for the 2017/2018 season was successful.
- 1,100 players evaluated and placed within 6 week timeframe.

What worked well?

- Starting Atom/PeeWee/Goalie evaluations before the Labour Day Long Weekend
 - This will be done for the 2017/2018 season as well
- Small ice sessions allowed evaluators to see players get more "touches" for passing/shooting and easier to evaluate comparable skating abilities in tight areas (& ability to compare forwards vs. defence)
- Less, but more knowledgeable evaluators
- Use of OneClicklce allowed us to quickly identify "outlier" evaluators and address
- Evolution Goaltending

What can we do better?

- o Moving away from skill session for players, very difficult for evaluators to differentiate
- Consistency in timing drills for lower age groups
- Still struggle with consistency of evaluators
- Close the gap between final evaluation sessions and communicating team/coach assignments

Pending changes to 2018/2019 Season

- Coaches will be used for age groups won't be able to evaluate their own son/daughter, but they will evaluate players they should know
 - Evaluators will be allowed to discuss players/observations in the stands; point out specific tendencies of players (positive and negative) to give a broader understanding of players abilities.
 - This is going to be modeled after Trails West's process
 - Will continue to recruit other knowledgeable hockey evaluators who are not necessarily coaches to round out the group
 - Evaluators will still have to provide independent scores (OneClick will identify outliers to the process)
- Coaches are going to be "recruited" to evaluate their own age group and last year

- To be considered for coaching roles, their involvement in evaluations process will be a factor
- Evaluators will now only "Rank" players based on their relative ranking in group, no longer will we use the grid system of various criteria
 - Goal is to better capture the "intangibles" of a player that doesn't necessarily fit well into former scoring system
- Peewee/Atom/Novice will have one timed Skate Session; by Last name not last team... Need this based on new team structure to fairly sort players initially
 - Drills will be redrafted Fwd/Backward skate to "easy" but "Butterfly" very difficult for some age groups
- Goal is to
 - A) Minimize the potential for misplacement of players who either haven't been on skates for months during evals and who evaluate different than they play during the season
 - B) Take advantage of coach input in a way that manages potential for bias
 - C) Quicker results, quicker turn-around on Admin time

Chris Beaton is adding one more change for the upcoming season. There is an 'Open Door Policy'. Chris Beaton and Matt Ashley will do a 'walk through' of the Evaluation Process with how things run. With including the coaches, will allow more input. Benchmarks are set based on other Associations.

REFEREE REPORT - Presented by Cori-Ann Mogan

- Central Zone switched systems to a Postal Code System for assigning Referees
- o Southwest Hockey consistently has the largest Referee Squad of the 14 Associations
- Southwest Hockey saw a 23% increase in squad size over 2016-2017
- There was 1104 Refereeing Opportunities this season
- o Developing Referees continues to be a challenge, however still working to develop referees
- Since meeting with Central Zone this past season, game scheduling has been better
- Continue to make sure that Coaches/Managers/Players know the rule about not being permitted to enter the Officials Dressing Rooms. High match penalties this year...on and after the game. Dressing room for refs is off limits to parents/coaches.
- Hosted a certification clinic and 2 mini-clinics to help educate our new and existing refs.
- Hockey Alberta Referees' Restructuring for the 2018-2019 season
 - Ultimate goal is to create a standardized and consistent system that eliminates duplication of services and allows for instruction, officiating, mentoring and planning the best path for Alberta's officials to succeed at the current level and progress to the next level(s).
 - All officials regardless of location will pay the same registration fee for their level.
 This may result in decreased fees for some and increased fees for others, due to standardizing across Alberta
 - Minor Hockey Associations will play an integral role in the recruitment and development of quality officials.
 - Hockey Alberta surveyed Saskatchewan Hockey Association and BC Hockey on their officiating structures and Hockey Alberta chose a hybrid of each of those models.
- Lari Epchtein was nominated for the lan Anderson Official of the Year. However another nominee was awarded this distinction we would like to 'Thank' Lari for being a dedicated Referee and representing Southwest Hockey with pride.
